Fourth Sunday of Easter Reflection—Clarissa Aljentera

The image of the Good Shepherd in this weekend's Gospel is one that can evoke care and nurture. There is an image of compassion that comes to mind when we encounter a God that looks out for our needs. In this intimacy and knowing, we can even relax and feel protected when we are in God's abundant care. The line in the Gospel of John that states, 'I am the Good Shepherd, I know mine and mine know me.

In our Black and Filipino home we try to blend some of our traditions and cultures together for our family. One concept in Filipino culture that resonates with the Good Shepherd is that of a spirit of kapwa (pronounced cop-wa). In the spirit of kapwa, you know those in your community and in your proximity. And the depth of kapwa is also very intergenerational. There's an image of great care when I think of this concept alongside the Good Shepherd. Individuals care as a community to tend to the needs of others in loving and kind ways.

As our family blends our cultural traditions we work to incorporate Catholic Social Teaching in our home as we think about what it means to take a justice-focused approach to how we move through our world and how we engage with our neighbors. In our faith tradition we do not have to look far for examples of holy men and women who gave their lives for others. We know stories of saints such as Maximilian Kolbe or Frances Cabrini. We know of congregations of religious women who work to serve communities


