The Truth is In the Wounds - Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman



Written in the Wounds

For all the condemnation Thomas the Doubter has received in 2000 years, I think there's something to admire in him.

Thomas is not unique. We all waver at some point, overcome by hesitation, distracted by the clamor of the world which seeks at every turn to shout above the whisper of the divine.

Thomas knows what he saw on Good Friday: his friend nailed to a cross, a sword driven through his body. He saw the blood and the water. He saw these things with his own eyes, eyes given to him by God, eyes which have never failed him before. And God doesn't ask us to suspend reality to believe in Him. He only asks us to be discerning about how that reality is interpreted in our hearts.

Thomas knows the man before him is either a fraud, preying on the hopes and anxieties of the traumatized disciples, or he is the Christ, the Savior of the world, accomplisher of impossible things. But where to look, to tell the difference?

Satan once appeared to the great mystic saint, Teresa of Avila, disguised as Jesus. She knew instantly that he was a fraud. Enraged, he demanded to know where his deception had failed. "You have no wounds," she told him simply.

Could we have accepted a savior who did not bleed? I don't think we could, because sooner or later, we would all stand before him and say, "Here is where the world hurt me. Here, and here, and here. What about you?" Christ can point to his hands, his feet, his side. "Here, and here, and here," he can say. "And I overcame them all."

It's the wounds, you see. The truth is in the wounds.

2024 Venerable Father Augustus Tolton Essay Contest





The Tolton Ambassadors-Chicago would like to announce that they are accepting essays from Catholic school students and students who faithfully attend a Catholic Church in the Archdiocese of Chicago for the **2024 Venerable Father Augustus Tolton Essay Contest.**

The contest is for students in grades 5 through 8

Essays must be 500 –1500 words in length. Parent permission is required to participate.

Essays should answer the following question:

We know that Father Tolton was the first recognizable Black Catholic priest in the United States. The road to priesthood and his life after ordination was not easy. We know his life was full of challenges, yet he continued to pursue his dream and became a Catholic priest. Reflect on Father Tolton's life as you answer the following:

Chicago has received over 30,000 men, women and children who fled from their home countries in South America in pursuit of a better life in the United States. You have seen news reports and read articles on their plight since arriving in Chicago. Some say, "We do not have enough resources to share with them." How do you think Fr. Tolton would want us to handle this crisis? What message would he give to inspire Catholics to live out the gospel of Jesus Christ?

Essays will be judged on Originality, Connection to Theme, Paragraph Construction, Organization and Mechanics.

Essays must be submitted by 11:59 pm Sunday April 14, 2024.

Winners will be announced Monday April 22, 2024. Three people will be awarded prizes.

Winners will receive a cash prize 14 place \$300, 2nd place \$200, 3nd place \$100

The prizes will be awarded Saturday May 4, 2024 during the Tolton Essay Luncheon. Luncheon tickets are free for students who submit essays and their parents. Tickets are \$30 or \$15 for those 12 and under.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Jesus answered (Nicodemus), "Amen, amen, I say to you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit." -John 3:5

Catechism of the Catholic Church 2nd edition paragraph 1215 states "Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit (vitae spiritualis ianua), and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church, and made sharers in her mission: "Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water in the word."

It is through this sacrament of initiation that we enter a new life with Christ and fellow believers.

Faith communities are built and nourished with committed believers. At Our Lady of Africa, it is important that we share what the sacred gift of Baptism has brought us and develop a deeper faith-filled relationship with all those who wish to have their children baptized. We are a faith family of believers and for any relationship to grow, it requires commitment, attention, and mutual intentional care. In that light, parents who desire Baptism for their child must be parishioners at Our Lady of Africa, attend Mass regularly, and attend a mandatory baptismal preparation class.

Baptism requests will be confirmed upon submission of the following requirements:

- 1. Completion of the application.
- 2. Parents and Godparents attend Baptismal Prep Class.

Families can decide to have the class via Zoom or meet in person with Ms. Carter. Only 1 Godparent is needed, but 2 are acceptable. Godparents should attend the class even if they will not be physically present on the day of the Baptism.

Requirements for Godparents

The Catholic Church requires the following of Godparents: (canon 874.1)

The godparents are to be chosen by the parents or guardians. They are to be at least sixteen years of age. They must be Catholics who have already been confirmed and have received the holy Eucharist. They should be leading a life in harmony with the faith, i.e., practicing Catholics (attending Mass), if married, in a valid Catholic Marriage, etc. They may not be the father or mother of the one to be baptized. You may choose one or two godparents. If you choose two, one must be male and the other female. The godparents must have the qualifications and intention to carry out this duty.

PLEASE NOTE:

**Non-Catholic Witness (Can.874.2) A baptized person from a non-Catholic ecclesial (church) community may be admitted as a witness to baptism but only with a Catholic Godparent. This person is not formally called a Godparent but will be referred to as a Christian Witness.

Children aged 5 and up are encouraged to attend Sunday school regularly to help them also learn about their faith.

Adults interested in Baptism are encouraged to enroll in the Order for Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA) and will be baptized at the Easter Vigil Mass.

Public Baptisms (baptisms during Mass) are available at the following times within the next two months:

April 14th, May 26th,

Private baptisms are also available by appointment.

The suggested donation offertory for baptisms is \$50.00.
